Lesson 1 "From hypotheses to variables"

Objectives of lesson 1:

- Understand the terminology
- Understand the importance of the theoretical framework
- Distinguish variables, indicators and data

Summary of the theoretical content

Through concrete examples, this lesson shows how the theoretical framework chosen to study an issue directly influences the response hypotheses and the variables that one will investigate.

The concept of variables, indicators, data, and methods stand in relation to each other.

Lesson Plan
